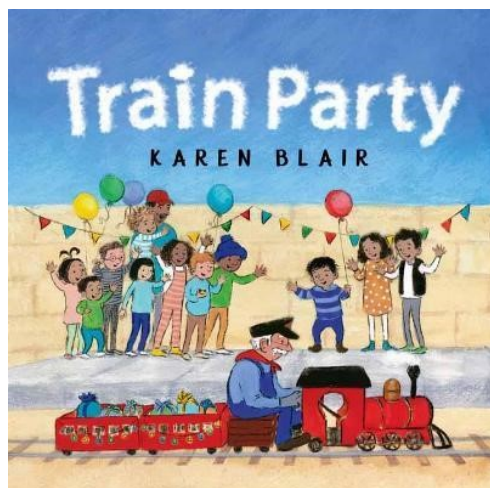

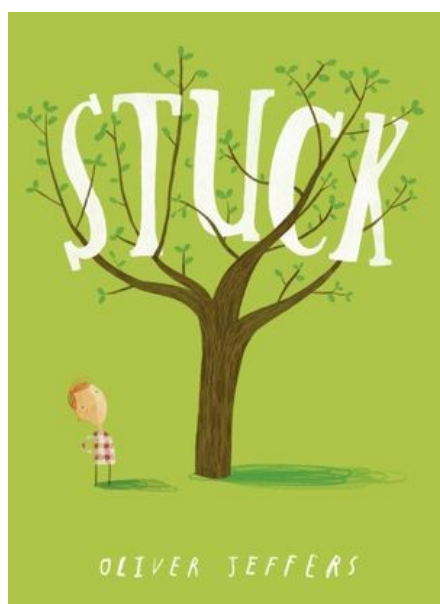
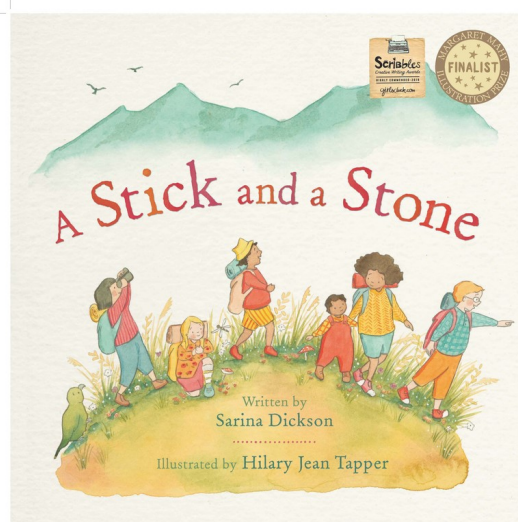
## Train Party by Karen Blair
