MISSION:

Founded in 1877, Berry Street exists to help those experiencing poverty, violence, and abuse, and to help families stay together in safe and healthy homes so they can create the future they imagine for themselves. This is what we mean by 'believing in children, young people, families and their future'.

FOSTER CARER VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES:

Our community is in urgent need of loving and supportive foster carers for local children and young people who are unable to live with their families.

- The number of children in out-of-home care continues to rise year-on-year. There were 12,809 children in out-of-home care in the state as of June 30, 2021, an almost 14 per cent increase from 11,271 in 2018.
- As of June 2023, the number of foster care enquiries from across the sector reached its lowest point in the last 20 years.

WHO CAN BE A BERRY STREET FOSTER CARER?

There is no 'typical' Berry Street foster carer. Just as every family is different, our foster carers come from diverse backgrounds, cultures and experiences. Our foster carers:

- are a minimum of 21 years of age
- have a spare bedroom to offer a child or young person
- can be single, married or in a de facto relationship
- can be from LGBTIQ+ communities
- can come from any religion, spirituality or nationality
- may or may not have children of their own
- can be in casual, part-time or full-time work – or perhaps not at all
- live in a home they rent or own

The BSL is offering an exciting opportunity to volunteer as a Digital Literacy Trainer at the SEED Project in Seymour.

Volunteers assist participants to learn a variety of computer and other digital skills including: using the internet, navigate basic computer or smart phone functions, learning Microsoft Programs, email, online applications, using MyGov, exploring Job Search Sites, using Zoom, and more.

You will have the opportunity to see participants achieve their learning goals and support them on their journey to securing employment, accessing study, and gain more independence in navigating our digital world.

Volunteer hours: 1-2 hours a week, Monday to Thursday, during business hours.

Volunteer tasks:

- Provide digital training to participants in one-on-one setting.
- Plan and prepare content for each training session based on participant's needs.
- Send meeting reminders to participants.

CO.AS.IT-Social Support Individual Visits & Community Visitors Scheme

WHY WE EXIST

The CO.AS.It Visitation Program provides social support to Italian older adults who find themselves socially isolated and lonely at home or in an aged care facility. Commencing in 2023, the program will be available to all nationalities.

WHAT WE DO

The program considers the interests and needs of the consumer and matches them with a community visitor who has similar interests. Visits occur on a weekly basis in a private home and at least fortnightly in an aged care facility.

Community Visitors undergo formal induction training and participate in on-going support meetings throughout their volunteering years of service. Every visitor has a current Police Check Clearance and is provided with current guidelines about the program.

The service is monitored by the Visitation Program Coordinator together with a team of Regional Coordinators across the Melbourne Metropolitan area and the rural region of Shepparton. The consumer, the community visitor and the Regional Coordinator are in direct and regular contact in order to maintain quality of service.

VOLUNTEER PURPOSE

Community Visitors experience the satisfaction of providing comfort and social support to those in need. They are rewarded in the knowledge that they are making someone else's life a little happier. Saint Francis of Assisi once said: "For it is in giving that we receive".

Volunteers give testimony to the truth of this saying. They also benefit from the camaraderie of this program. They meet other generous people like themselves that give a little of their time for the wellbeing of others. CO.AS.IT. values and appreciates this generosity in a variety of ways.

Consumers maintain connections with the wider community. They gain mental stimulation to break the burden of loneliness and isolation as well as obtaining an increased sense of belonging and self-worth.

ROLES & PROGRAMS VOLUNTEERS MAY UNDERTAKE OR BE INVOLVED WITH

Volunteers support clients to achieve their individual goals, this may be in the home to provide social support whilst living independently or in a community group setting, for example an aged care facility.

Activities may include:

- General conversation to prevent the feeling of loneliness and isolation
- Playing cards or a game which may be unavailable to the consumer when living alone
- Share in other activities such as cooking, gardening, playing or listening to music etc
- Provide a short respite for carers who wish to take a little break through the day
- Pet therapy
- Playing music, reading poetry or providing a group activity in an aged care facility

Court Network

Court Network

Court Network is free and confidential non-legal community service. We specifically provide non-legal support, information, referrals, and advocacy. All of our services are provided by dedicated volunteers who are highly trained and skilled. All of our services are available to all court users, including, victims, witnesses, accused, family, friends, parents, and guardians.

OUR MISSION

To provide the community with volunteers who stand beside, empower and instil confidence in all court users.

OUR VISION

To be a nationally recognised organisation, providing the community with volunteers to support all court users and enhance access to justice.

OUR VALUES

Inclusion and empowerment, curiosity and courage, excellence, collaboration, empathy and compassion, integrity.

OUR PROGRAMS

Victorian In-Court Program:

Eligibility:

- Available across 29 Courts in Victoria including Magistrates, VCAT, County, Supreme, Coroners and Federal Circuit and Family Court of Australia.
- Over 18 years of age.

Victorian Telephone Service:

Eligibility:

- Available to any court user attending court in Victoria.
- Over 18 years of age.

Online Support Service:

Eligibility:

- Available to court users attending VCAT teleconference or zoom hearings.
- Identify as having a disability or mental health concern.
- Only available through referral via Disability Liaison Officer.
- Over 18 years of age

The range of support includes:

- Pre-court support, during court support and post court support.
- Non-legal information about what happens before, during and after court.

- Information about court etiquette, explaining court processes and how to navigate court on the day.
- Help the court users navigate the court on the day and provide practical information.
- Assist you to get the help you need to address your safety concerns and arrange access to safe spaces.
- Non-legal support to prepare for court.
- Referrals to legal services and community legal centres.
- Help you to understand the potential outcomes, and next steps that you might have to take.
- Providing referral pathways to key support services.
- Information on how to navigate online court hearings.

Elder Rights Advocacy – Aged Care Volunteer Visitors Scheme

MISSION

The Aged Care Volunteer Visitors Scheme (ACVVS) is a social-based program for people who could benefit from having a caring and dedicated volunteer make regular contact with them to provide friendship and company. This may involve face-to-face visiting, writing emails, letters and cards, connecting on video chat or talking on the telephone.

PURPOSE

ACVVS is for people who:

- live in an aged care home
- live in their own home and are on the waiting list for a Home Care Package
- live in their own home and receive services through a Home Care Package.

The Aged Care Volunteer Visitors Scheme is an Australian Government Funded Initiative.

It is free to participate in ACVVS.

VOLUNTEER PURPOSE

The ACVVS team matches care recipients with volunteers who have similar interests, hobbies, background and preferences.

The ACVVS team will introduce care recipients and volunteers by phone or in person and will stay in regular contact to make sure you are enjoying the friendship.

Volunteers will make contact regularly (either weekly or fortnightly), at a convenient time. You might see each other face-to-face, write letters, talk on the phone, or video chat together.

Visits are relaxed and social, focusing on conversations and having fun together. Care recipients and volunteers might choose to:

- have a cuppa and chat
- take a walk or go on an outing
- swap information about shared hobbies or interests
- watch a favourite TV show together
- do another activity that you both

VISION

FamilyCare is a non-government, not-for-profit organisation, offering welfare, carer and disability support services to families and young people in Shepparton, Seymour, Cobram, Kinglake, Wallan and surrounding districts, and have been providing these services to people in the Goulburn Valley since 1984.

FamilyCare works with individuals, families and communities to increase wellbeing, build strengths and encourage optimism. Our vision is strong families and communities. FamilyCare relies heavily on volunteers to support these programs and services.

Child and Family Services provide relevant support and services to families. The various programs and activities that are offered under this umbrella are designed to enhance parent to child, partner-to-partner and sibling to sibling interactions. Carer Support Services aims to support carers through the provision of short-term respite, information and support. Carers support is looking for volunteers to support carers by spending time with the person that they care for. This enables the carer to have a short break away from their caring responsibilities, while the volunteer provides companionship and support to the care recipient.

Disability Support Services operates the IntoRec Program to support children and young people with a disability by providing recreational opportunities and specialised support options. Young Peer Support volunteers work alongside the children and young people to support them to access and participate in the activities.

The Book Inn is a second hand book store located at 94 Wyndham Street Shepparton and is managed by dedicated Volunteers. The shop has a large variety of books catering for all ages. Book Inn volunteers work in the shop as part of the team that sells the books that have been generously donated. For anyone with an interest in books or literature this is an ideal place to volunteer.

YRIPP – Youth Referral and Independent Person Program

MISSION

Volunteer Independent Persons attend police interviews with young people less than 18 years at designated police stations around Victoria.

The Independent Person is there to protect the young person from the disadvantage inherent in their age and to ensure that the young person understands what is happening to them and why.

PURPOSE

The Youth Referral and Independent Person Program (YRIPP) deliver a high quality system of adult volunteers called “Independent Persons”.

These volunteers attend police interviews with young people in police custody when a parent or guardian is not available.

YRIPP also seeks to divert young people from future offending through early intervention at the point of police contact.

VOLUNTEER PURPOSE

The Independent Person is there to protect the young person from the disadvantage inherent in their age and to ensure that the young person understands what is happening to them and why.

The Independent person offers referrals to the young person with the aim of diverting the young person from further contact with the justice system.
