Kialla Lakes Residents Group

The Kialla Lakes Residents Group had its first meeting in 1999, and by June 2000 the group was incorporated and had 21 financial members.

The group has worked on a number of initiatives in partnership with Council, the developer and other community groups. The Residents Group have advocated with these stakeholders for works to occur with the local community Some of the achievements include advocacy for additional tree planting, installation of doggy rubbish bins, received sponsorship for a table and chair in Ganaway Reserve and input into a land management plan affecting the area.

The Kialla Lakes Residents Group welcomes new members.

What is our Neighbourhood Plan?

The Kialla Lakes Neighbourhood Plan is a written document that identifies the Kialla Lakes community's vision for the future and the priorities and actions the community has identified to achieve this vision. The Neighbourhood Plan will be a guide for future projects and activities in our neighbourhood over the next five years.

Achievement of the priorities identified within the plan will require ongoing community support. It is acknowledged that the priorities contained within this plan are reviewed annually to ensure that the priorities remain reflective of the emerging needs of the community.

Developing our Neighbourhood Plan

Kialla Lakes residents were invited to participate in the Neighbourhood Plan development in a number of different ways.

Community Surveys

Surveys were distributed to every household in Kialla Lakes. Questions were:

- What do you love about Kialla Lakes?
- What is your vision for Kialla Lakes for the future?
- What are your top ideas?

The surveys were used as base questions for all consultation session. At the end of the consultation 66 surveys were submitted.

Kialla Gardens Retirement Village

Residents from Kialla Gardens independent living units were encouraged to participate in the development of the Neighbourhood Plan. Council Officers attended a community dinner to speak with the group further about their ideas for the area.

'One on ones' at the Lake/s

Members from the Kialla Lakes Residents Group and Council Officers spoke with residents at / around the lakes at different times throughout the consultation period. These 'one on ones' raised further awareness about the consultation being undertaken and for different ideas to be raised.

Free Coffee Van

Residents were invited for a free coffee from a coffee van at the playground between Lowanna Waters and Amaroo Lakes. Residents braved the elements to contribute their ideas for the Neighbourhood Plan.

Pop Up Shop

In July 2014, a 'Pop Up Consultation Shop' was created within a

vacant shopfront in the Kialla Lakes Shopping Complex. VMS boards (flashing signs) were placed at both entrances to the neighbourhood to raise awareness about the pop up shop activities and to encourage residents to be involved. Over three days a number of community activities were held to encourage residents to come together to participate in these activities. The activities included; arm knitting, walking group, free family dinners, and body balance class. As well, Kialla Resident Group members and Council Officers were

available to speak with people about the Neighbourhood Plan.







Kialla Lakes

Kialla Lakes neighbourhood is bounded by the Broken River in the north, Archer Road to the east and Goulburn Valley Highway to the west. A map of the area is included below.


Kialla is named from an Aboriginal word for part of the Goulburn River. The first stage of the Kialla Lakes subdivision commenced around 1985. The Kialla Lakes neighbourhood will continue to expand as land is currently for sale in the south of the area.
